1. Introduction

SUPER-i is an EU Horizon 2020 funded project which aims to develop new financing models for energy efficiency-refurbishments in the social housing sector. To do so, SUPER-i is rolled out along three project-pipelines in Denmark, Italy, and Slovenia, and three partner countries, Belgium, Spain, and the UK. In and across WP1, WP2, and WP3, knowledge is gathered and developed in the three project-pipelines and analysed and presented in an online toolkit (SUPER-i guidebook) and portal (SUPER-i portal).

The main objectives of WP4 are to, 1) build capacity of the stakeholders in the three project-pipelines and, 2) to implement replication activities in the three partner countries. More specifically, T4.1 is charged with designing the Capacity Building Program, T4.2 is charged with identifying stakeholders for the Capacity Building Program, and T4.3 is charged with holding the Capacity Building Program. T4.4 is then charged with designing a replication plan and holding replication activities.

This deliverable is part of task T4.2 which consists in selecting the key stakeholders in the 6 European countries for participating in capacity building programmes. The task of identifying and collecting stakeholders for capacity building seminars, as well as for other project-related events and activities, does not end with the submission of this report. Additional stakeholders to be involved in capacity building events will be added during the course of the project and the database will be updated throughout the project duration.

1.1. Scope of the deliverable

The stakeholders are identified within six key groups: **social housing organisations; financial institutions and investors; energy service companies (ESCOs) and energy providers; local governments, policymakers and regulators; research institutions and universities; SMEs**. All of them represent key players in the process of financing energy efficiency renovation in social housing, and a minimum of 3-5 stakeholders from each target group will participate in the capacity building programmes.

In terms of geographical coverage, stakeholders are based in the 6 project countries (Belgium, Denmark, Italy, Slovenia, Spain, United Kingdom) and also include organisations and institutions acting at the European and global level.

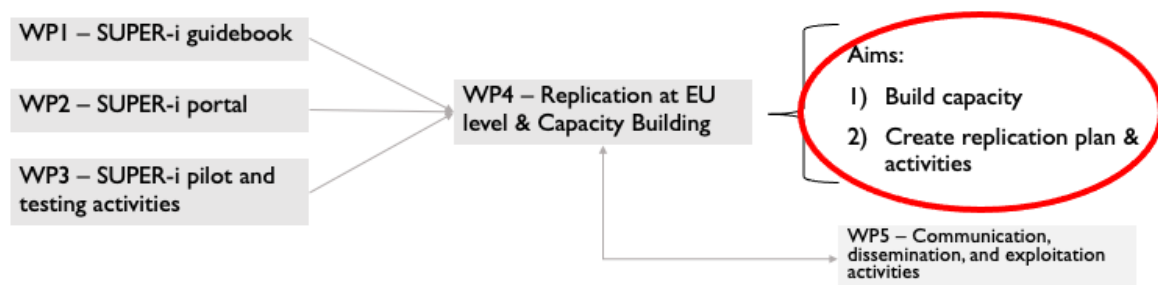
The identified stakeholders from the three SUPER-i partner countries participating in the pilot project pipelines (Italy, Denmark, Slovenia) will be hosting demonstrations of significant

investments in EE refurbishment of social housing stock (WP3). At a later stage, SUPER-i partners will involve the key stakeholders from Spain, Belgium and UK.

1.2. Relation to other Work packages

The capacity building programme will build on the SUPER-i Toolkit, which integrates findings from **WP1**, the **SUPER-i Guidebook** – a comprehensive range of support and/or services to facilitate access to EE, **WP2**, **data and information** about existing social housing stocks and the **financial need** and their possible **involvement in green innovative tenders** (ePPPs) and **WP3**, pilot **application of financial instruments and evaluation methodology** in each pilot project pipelines.

The relation between the WPs can be seen below.



WP4 will be implementing the CBP in the three pilot countries and contribute to WP5, Communication, Dissemination and exploitation activities.

2. Target groups and key stakeholders

To support the activities of the capacity building programme, it is necessary to identify a consistent and inclusive group of key stakeholders from the selected target groups to be involved in the seminars (webinars / web-based training).

The 13 partners of the SUPER-i project are representatives of all the different stakeholder categories. They were asked to provide inputs suggesting external actors that could participate in the capacity building events providing added value to the programme with their expertise and relevance in the sector. The focus of the capacity building events is on ESCOs, financial institutions and investors, social housing organisations and universities from Denmark, Italy and Slovenia, whereas the following replication activities will also involve policymakers and SMEs and will take place in broader regions within Denmark, Italy and Slovenia and in the other SUPER-i partner countries, namely Belgium, Spain and UK.

The following paragraphs will describe the selected target groups and their relevance in implementing energy efficiency and renewable energy projects in the housing sector. For each stakeholder group, there is a brief introduction to the SUPER-i partners and the invited external stakeholders participating in the capacity building events.

2.1. Social Housing Organisations

The SUPER-i project will generate investments toward the social housing sector, which will benefit from energy-efficient renovations to reduce energy poverty and support the European Commission in implementing the European Green Deal.

The context of social housing is remarkably diverse in Europe in terms of administrative and asset management methods, which differ from country to country, types of providers and organisations involved, financing mechanisms, and size of the sector compared to the total national housing stock. What all European realities have in common, however, is the need for heavy investment in energy requalification, as a consistent portion of the actual social housing stock was built when technologies were not advanced, and the energy characteristics of homes were not a priority as the relative cost of energy supply was much lower than in recent years.

The Social Housing Organisations involved in the SUPER-i partnership are **Housing Europe**, the European Federation of public, cooperative and social housing associations, whose members and partners manage about 11% of the existing dwellings in Europe - and three of their members: **BL**, representative of Danish public housing organisations, **ATER Trieste**, the agency that manages public housing in the Trieste area, and **HFROS**, public housing Fund in Slovenia. Each of these three partners comes from countries involved in the pilot project pipelines (Denmark, Italy and Slovenia) and they will organise one regional Roundtable each.

The project partners have suggested the following Social Housing Organisations (listed by country in the table below) to participate in the capacity building events. They include both social housing federations with significant potential for outreach to their members (i.e. housing companies on the ground) and some specific social housing companies at local level that have been already identified thanks to previous projects and contacts.

2.2. Financial Institutions

The EE investments that the SUPER-i project will generate are the result of a direct dialogue between social housing organisations and public bodies on one side and financial intermediaries and institutions (LFIs and IFIs) on the other.

Therefore, the participation of financial institutions and other private investors in the capacity building events will allow a direct dialogue between the social housing managers and potential investors for smart financing of sustainable energy investments in the social housing stock. The involvement of local financial institutions makes it possible to structure market-oriented financial products to finance the improvement in EE of the social housing buildings.

The main financial institution included in the partnership of the SUPER-i project is **Tendercapital**, an independent European organisation that works in the asset management field and with solid experience in UCITS V and Alternative products. In addition, **CiviESCo**, **EEIP** and the **University of York** will provide connections with other investors that operate or are looking to invest in the social

housing market sector and are interested in testing innovative financing schemes coupled with bankable projects.

2.3. ESCOs, Energy efficiency experts and Energy providers

The public-private partnership model concerning the interaction between public housing stock managers and private investors is enriched in the SUPER-i project with the involvement of the ESCOs (Energy Service Companies) and innovative energy experts/providers. ESCOs are companies that provide energy services to final users, including supply and installations of EE equipment and/or the refurbishment of the building. Unlike traditional energy providers, ESCOs tie their profit to improved energy performance and savings¹. In addition to ESCOs, this group of stakeholders includes those organisations that can use their expertise and network to make profitable and streamlined EE refurbishment projects.

In the SUPER-i project, ESCOs and innovative energy consulting organisations play a pivotal role in facilitating EE investments for the social housing sector due to their capacity to deliver efficiency projects based on long-term contracts. The participation of ESCOs and experts in the SUPER-i capacity building events will bring the energy efficiency market closer to the social housing sector by showcasing innovative investment opportunities for private investors in energy refurbishment projects of public housing buildings.

The project coordinator **CiviESCO** is an Energy Service Company, which operates as ESCO and advisor for financing "green" projects for private and public assets. **Element Energy** is one of the leading consulting organisations in the UK for the energy efficiency and low carbon energy technologies across the buildings, transport, industry, and power sectors. **European Green Cities** is a non-profit organisation formed by an international network, independent of political and financial interests. 2.5. Local Governments, policymakers and regulators

In the PPPs mentioned above, the role of private companies is to implement EE interventions, while local public institutions are responsible for monitoring and evaluating the quality of the services delivered. Given the often public nature of the stock of buildings earmarked for social housing, in many projects, the recipient of the interventions will be organisations reporting to local authorities. For this reason, capacity building events will be an opportunity to discuss the policy objectives, either at the local level, such as improving housing conditions for residents in social housing or more general objectives, such as reducing emissions. During these capacity building events, energy experts and SMEs will be able to discuss with regulators and policymakers how the proposed solutions can deliver the policy objectives.

2.6. Research institutions

The heterogeneity of the SUPER-i partnership demonstrates the explicit intention to structure dissemination and capacity building events that can benefit from the different competencies required for implementing energy improvement measures in public buildings at all stages. Therefore, the partnership includes academia and researchers working in the energy efficiency

fields, finance and business models. The aim is to support the transition towards an efficient financing system for EE projects in social housing with a methodological approach.

The involvement of research organisations in capacity building events allows for the contextualisation of policy objectives and the economic model that can support interventions towards them.

3. Conclusions

This report has presented the main results of the mapping of key stakeholders in the framework of the Super-i project. The objective of this deliverable is to constitute a database of stakeholders to be involved in capacity building seminars as well as for other project-related events and activities in the six project countries (namely Belgium, Denmark, Italy, Slovenia, Spain, United Kingdom) as well as at European level.

The list of stakeholders identified by the project partners at the time of writing this report includes a total 136 relevant entities and organisations, grouped along the following six main categories: social housing organisations; financial institutions and investors; energy service companies (ESCOs) and energy providers; local governments, policymakers and regulators; research institutions and universities; SMEs. A number of additional organisations were identified which do not fall precisely under any of the above mentioned categories but nevertheless represent potential relevant participants, which were included as 'Others'.

The results show there is a wide variety of end users and stakeholders identified, most of which could be impacted in a way or another by the project. As such, they are the relevant target audiences for the Super-i project and in particular replication and capacity-building activities implemented under WP4. All stakeholders are needed and important to the success of the project, and a balanced approach and cooperation among them is needed to enhance and speed up the process of financing energy efficiency renovation in social housing.

Lastly, it should be highlighted that the stakeholders database is a living document meaning that it will be updated along the project by identifying new stakeholders etc. through the different annual activities. This report being finalised in M12 of the project, partner organisations will be expected to continue supporting Housing Europe with stakeholder identification, particularly as a result of dissemination and capacity-building activities carried out at national level.
